Mr. Pratt.

I learn that Mr. Garrison has made sale of your House in some Start
then seems to be some difficulty in
relation to it - Help you have given
Mr. G. the House to sell since I left
Lynn 29 of July for the purpose of getting
you would not sanction his doing
of sale. I find there is something wrong
in the affair - I wish you not to commit
yourself to him, if you have not already
If you give a bond to J. Garrison & Co
Garrison has no right to sell your property
under that obligation - for we have dissolved
and Mr. G. has nothing to do with the property
more than I have, and in this case I claim
your bonds for me I think you will give
it to me. When you hear the character of Mr. Garrison
I was negotiating with a man at the time
I heard that G. had sold the House -
