I suppose you have done "lecturing". These one you the crushing responsibility of a Mississippian - well, it is good to bear the yoke in our youth I suppose - If you will allow me in a little egotism, on this occasion, I think I have been bearing pretty heavily of late - but sometimes it seems quite too heavy to carry - How many sermons do you suppose I have written since Aug? only 21 - & preache, I do it, how many times really - usually 3 lectures one week & 2 the next alternately - Once I had to write nearly the body of a funeral sermon between 8 AM & 2 PM - It was on the death of Mrs Perry, one of our most intelligent members - about 300 were present, I suppose you have heard how we have been persecuted from one ^{worse} & fled to another - not so large but more comfortable in winter - Our congregation has been increasing slowly & the universal decreasing - we have had very good singing generally & they none - this never them no doubt.
