Brother Weston

Dear Sir

Yours directed to me at Boston was duly recd and I felt very glad to hear so good a report from Marcellus. I felt somewhat anxious about him at the time fearing that he might get discontented and would not learn any at his school. I heard from him the past week by the way of My Plaisted who saw him there and Marcellus sent word by him for me to send him his Pistols which I shall not do as I do not want him to use fire arms at present as he is not old enough to do so. I want you should caution him about the same and see that he does not have any to play with from the other Boys. I have been thinking about letting him come to Gardiner on the 4th of next month but shall leave it altogether with you to do as you think best. I did not know but what it might get him discontented if he should come down and shall not say anything to him about it.
