

Haybury July 1st 1842
Monday P.M.

Dear George & Stuart,

We have had a county
Temperance Convention here today, with an ad-
dress from one Murray, a Washingtonian
Universalist minister formerly, tho' it is said he
has given up his Universalism of late. There was
a large collection from this & the town, about us.
I did not attend of course - have not been within
doors of a meeting house since last August.

Ma & I went down into the garden on the Intercalle
in the forenoon & found so much to do that I got
tired all out & have not got over it yet - my feet
continue to pain me & I suffer very much from
difficulty of breathing. I am not troubled much with Groul.

Tuesday evening July 5. We have just got thro' with
a heavy thunder shower - have had one every day
since July came in, except yesterday - I rec'd your Pic-
-ayure today. I have ordered the Adventure to be stopped,
& henceforth shall have no paper but the Mirror.

Wednesday evening 6th We have had another thun-
-der shower this afternoon & there is beautiful sun-
-set & prospect of fine weather. Three weeks from
tomorrow is commencement! time goes
fast - you have enough to do, I expect, tho'
you may not study or read much. Be
careful of your health - do not expose your-
selves to the night dews & keep out of the water.
Keep cool & collected & do every thing up in good
season - If you cannot sell all that you want
to, show them away in Lewis' room & get him to sell
them for you - bring home your hammock.
