Friday Evening July 15. We rec^d your letter & papers yesterday - We were very glad to hear that you are well & that you rec^d the money from Concord & The calculation now is that Mr & Mrs Southern with their daughter & Sarah Johnston will go on to Commencement & I believe Dr Evans will go.

I think you will need to rest over Sunday at Concord, but if you think otherwise when you get there you may come directly on unless they are very urgent for you to stop.

Monday morning July 18th. Mr Southern thinks some of going on with one of Smith's stages and if he should can bring one of or both of you home, but it is uncertain as yet -
