

Hayden Saturday P.M. June 18-1842

Dear George & Stuart,

I have but just finished a letter that I sent you by Mr. Richardson, but as some other opportunity may present, to send you another I will begin & endeavor to have it ready. We have had a good many meetings here of late & there are several young people, who seem quite anxious about themselves - we hope & pray that the impression may be, by the influence of the Spirit of God, and if so, indeed not it may result in the eternal salvation of those interested - Mary Barrows, Sarah Johnson, Georgianna South, Mary Hunt, William Hunt, William Eastman of Conway and a young Wadsworth from Wiscasset, I have here named as ~~some~~ among those, who are serious.

We hope you will no longer neglect the object for which you were called into life -

Monday P.M. June 20. We have had great rains of late & today, it is much cooler - Dr. Bradley & his mother have started for Portland, to attend the State Conference. I have been in to see the Colo. today - have seen him but once before since I came home - he is all broken down - is a mere wreck - you will be astonished to see him. I am evidently better than I was, when I left Concord, but I cannot do anything now, without being all out of breath in one minute - I cannot haemore than five hills of corn before I am ever gone & have to quit - things have grown rapidly here for a week past - I see by the papers you had snow in New Hampshire lately - we had none, but had some frost - I have potatoes however 6 inches high -
