Do not be mean if we are as poor as Job, but do not spend one dollar that is not necessary, nor a cent further. You seem to be very anxious to know what you are to do & where you are to be, after you are graduated. I don't think it worth while to trouble your selves at all about that, at present. If you live to get home, I have no doubt you can spend a year or more here to good advantage, if you are disposed to improve your time - then can as many medical & Law books, here as you can read in one year, & in the same time we must see what course Providence points out for us. I should be glad, if it is the will of God, to see all out here & all of us pack up & be off to Philadelphia.
