Saturday Evening 25<sup>th</sup> Dr Bradley & his mother returned from Portland & Wallis - no news - all the children here are having Measles, & chicken Pox & Mumps - John Evans second boy died this afternoon, after having some of these diseases.

Tuesday evening 28<sup>th</sup>. We have plenty of rain. If you get any money from Concord, write me on the reception of it and tell how much etc. We expect you will go down to Concord on Friday after commencement & stay there until the next Monday or longer, if they are very urgent you may not have an opportunity to visit them again for years. You will take the boxes we left in the garret if you can, & get the books of Philbrick I left to be bound. Mr Southworth's will go on to commencement with a compass & two hours -

Wednesday morning 29. We had a powerful rain last night - we are to have a County Temperance Convention here on next Monday July 4<sup>th</sup>, but how much of an affair it will be is uncertain I think. Write in case of a mail after you get this and let us know how you are - you had better keep out of the water - it is very unwholesome this season - keep cool & don't be in a hurry - do every thing deliberately & right, keep a good appetite but don't eat too much and avoid every appearance of evil - treat every body well & make friends & no enemies - I shall probably write you once more by mail & then again by those who go on to commencement - have every thing done up in good season & be ready to be off as soon as may be - Pay all bills & take receipts - your truly
