

Christ. Moving Seaforth July 15. 1847

Dear Mother

Yours of the 13th reaches me last evening. The exchange shall be as you wish. I come over tomorrow so that I can see you both as well as my family.

By a line from Dr. Gullitt, I learn that the Trustees appropriate for your support \$200. so ~~that~~ they mean to build up on N. Beilport.

I do not feel quite satisfied with the result of our Missionary efforts in the State. Our \$15,000 fell short of them. We did not reach three fourths of ^{the} sum aimed at. Is it not shameful? I believe if every other County had increased their subscriptions ~~as~~ in the same ratio & non "bleeding noses" we should have risen above the sum specified. I don't like this resolving, voting, & speaking making without corresponding action. I have seen too much of it.

We reached home Sat. a.m. I am pretty pretty well jaded. I found Mr. McCreary had closed his pilgrimage. I was just in season to attend his funeral. The Good Fellows paraded again but I got into no collision with them.
