

Saco Saturday Feb 13<sup>th</sup> 1842

Sir

Yours of the eighth came to hand last evening and I sat down this morning to say to you I should like to have you send the money you spoke of, by mail. Mr Jordan has been talking of going east all winter but has now given it up on account of the travelling, there is no snow on the ground here, has not been enough for skidding for 5 or 6 weeks, our folks are well here, I am at work at joinery for the Factory Company, have been and shall be probably steadily employed.

We have had a Revival of religion here this winter Numbers have found the Road of great Peace and will say whereas once I was blind now I see.

I should like to see my good friends in Foxcroft & serve. Please remember me to Mr Wells and family and (as I wont begin to name) to all enquirers after an unworthy Friend
