Dr. Sir,

I have not seen Mr. Philip Libby before today, and could not write before.

He wishes for a copy of the deed from Andrew Dow to Joseph Smith^{sr} made about a dozen years ago, he thinks, perhaps longer. He also wishes you to examine from the date of that deed, and see whether said Smith has conveyed that piece of land to any person or persons. I suppose it will appear that Smith did convey it in the fraudulent deed of Smith to Gilpatrick, and that a small piece of that tract was levied upon by the York Bank. Mr. Libby supposes there is no other conveyance, but wishes as far as he can to prove a negative. He does not wish for a copy of the levy, but would like to have you take a note of it, so that you may bring the book into court, if necessary. The action will probably be for trial on Monday, the first case.
