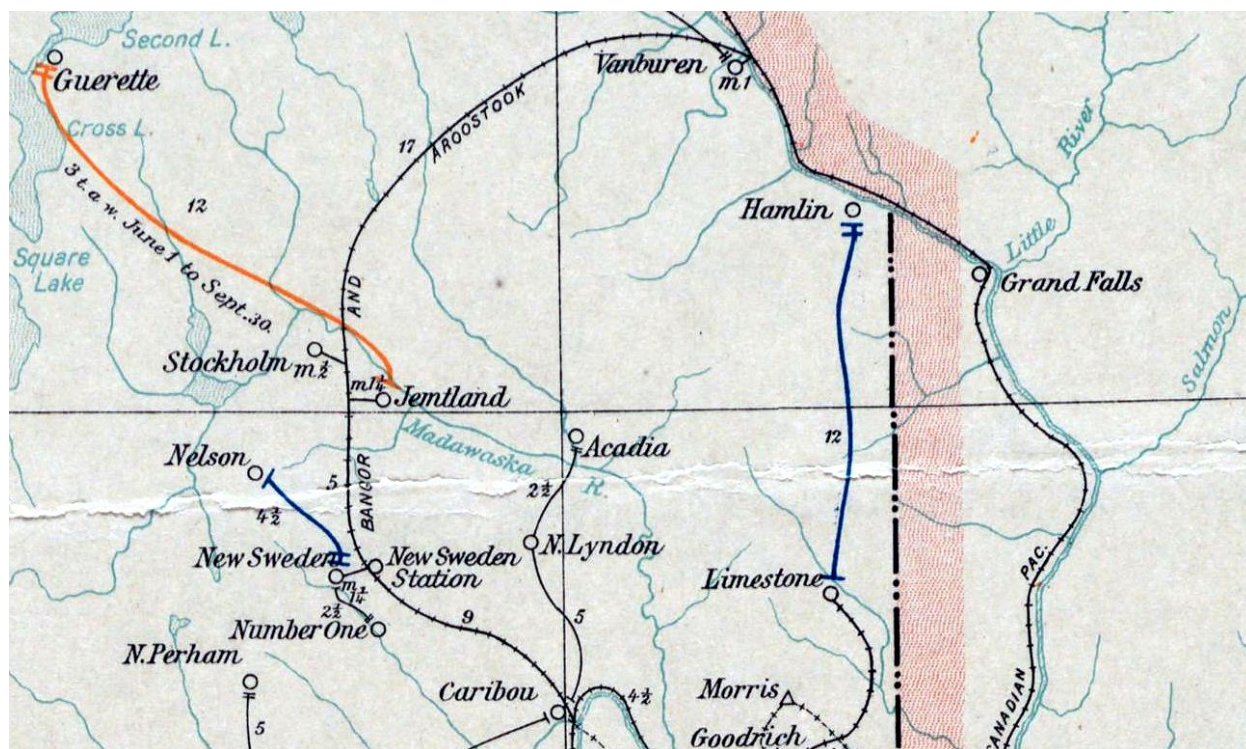
Stockholm also became the name of the Plantation that was organized in 1895. Stockholm became a Town in 1911.

During the history of the town of Stockholm, there has been only one post office.

Briefly, the history of this one is as follows:

1. [Stockholm](#) Post Office opened on 23 March 1901 and is still operating.

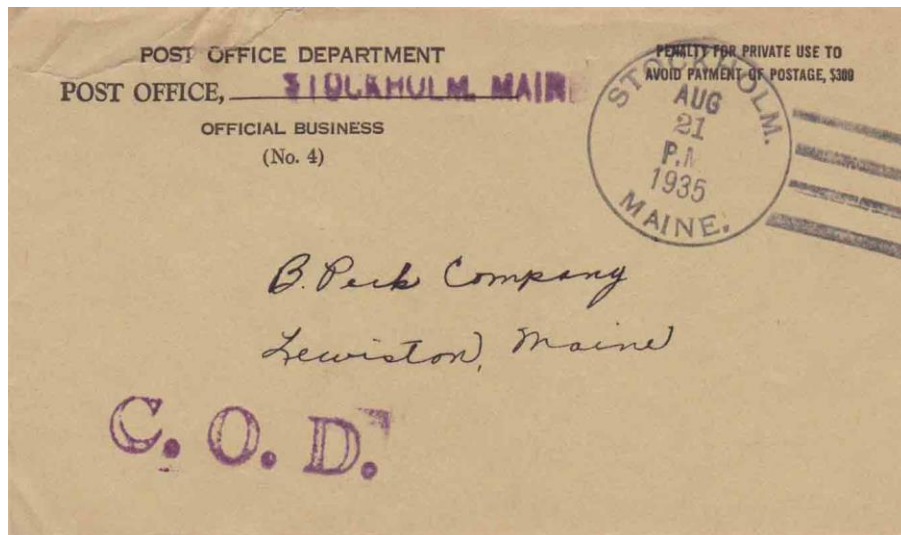
Stockholm Post Office became a Presidential Post Office.
